### **Senior Accomplishments: Class of 2010**

#### **Reed Carr (Sr.):**

**2009:** A Saint Captain as a senior, Reed Carr played in all 15 games for the Saints as a senior and was a standout at midfield. A member of the Liberty League All Academic team, he scored his first collegiate point with an assist in a 6-0 win over Potsdam and scored his first collegiate goal in a 3-2 win over Geneseo. He also scored a goal in the win at Clarkson.

**2008:** Not only did Carr earn his first collegiate start, but his junior season was highlighted by the fact that he played and started in all of the Saints' 21 contests as he became a big part of St. Lawrence's offense in 2008.

**2007:** Carr saw much more playing time in his sophomore year, as the Williston, VT native became a consistent player off the bench for the Saints. He played in 11 games and had three shots, including one on goal during the season. Carr was named to the 2007 Liberty League All-Academic Team for his achievements in the classroom.

**2006:** Carr was a reserve player for the Saints in his rookie campaign, seeing time in one game against North Country rival Clarkson on October 14th.

#### **Yoon Sik Jung (Sr.):**

**2009:** Yun Sik Jung scored his first collegiate goal and also had an assist in a 4-0 win at Elmira. He played in all but one game for the Saints as a senior midfielder.

**2008:** In his junior season, Jung played in two games and started in both, but was unable to continue through the season due to injury. His efforts in the classroom earned him a spot on the 2008 Liberty League All-Academic Team.

**2007:** Jung played in 14 games for the Saints in his sophomore campaign, and had his first collegiate start against RIT on September 14th. The Busan, Korea native had seven shots in 2007, including 2 on goal. He was also named to the 2007 Liberty League All-Academic Team for his efforts in the classroom.

**2006:** Jung used his tall frame and physical style to earn playing time in his first season with the Scarlet and Brown. The Busan, Korea native came off the bench in all twenty of the team's games in 2006. Though he didn't tally a point in his rookie season, Jung added depth and skill to the Saints midfield and became a key asset in their run to the NCAA Tournament.





**Joseph Mattina (Sr.):**

**2009:** This season Joey started in 8 games, and played in a total of 13. Joey started the season in fair form but really turned it up a few notches in the final two games of the season against Plattsburgh and Liberty League rival Clarkson. Mattina ended the game against Clarkson with two goals and three assists for seven points, just one mark short of the Saint record for points in a game.

**2007:** Joey was injured this season but supported the saints by professionally filming all matches.

**2006:** As a sophomore, Mattina played in 20 games, starting in 8 contests. He added 2 assists to this year's point tally.

**2005:** In his first season as a Saint, Joey played in 18 matches and started in 5. He finished his solid rookie season with 2 assists.

**Terrence O'Brien (Sr.):**

**2009:** Terrence played in 14 of 15 games for the Saints as a senior and contributed a goal and two assists in addition to solid defensive play. He scored the game-winner and also had an assist in the 4-0 win over Elmira. He also had an assist in a 3-2 win over Geneseo, setting up the game winner.

**2008:** In his junior campaign, O'Brien played and started in each of the Saints' 21 contests. He was an essential piece to the St. Lawrence defense and scored the Saints' lone goal against nationally-ranked Trinity (TX).

**2007:** O'Brien had another great year for the Saints starting in 17 of the 18 games in his 2007 campaign. His first collegiate point came in the opening game against New Jersey City, as O'Brien assisted the game-winning goal. The Saratoga Springs, NY back netted his first goal of his college career against Rochester off a direct kick from nearly 35 yards out.

**2006:** O'Brien started the year coming off the bench, but soon worked his way into the starting line-up at the back position where he ended up starting in 17 of the team's 20 games as a rookie. He fired seven shots, but is yet to collect his first career point. He was recognized as the Liberty League's "Rookie of the Week" three times and was an All-Conference Honorable Mention.

#### Co-Rookie of the Week – **Alex Laird**

Laird played excellent in both away contests of the week. St. Lawrence prevailed over Skidmore 2-1 and was defeated by Union 1-0 as the Saints played a man down for 87 minutes, holding the game to a 0-0 draw until the final 10 minutes.





### **For the Week of October 5**

#### **Co-Defensive Player of the Week – Alex Laird**

Freshman Alex Laird had a quick and crowd-silencing answer to Houghton College's second-half tying goal as he scored his first collegiate game-winner, spoiling Houghton's Homecoming game and sending the Saints on their way to a 4-2 win on Saturday. Laird scored his third of the year off a long throw-in by Stewart just 1:23 after the tying goal by Houghton to put the Saints back on top and Dan Marvin took a feed from Joey Mattina and beat Houghton goalie Steve Zacchigna at 75:06 to complete the scoring.

### **For the Week of November 2**

#### **Offensive Performer of the Week – Joey Mattina**

Freshman Sam DeMellow made it a 2-0 game with his sixth of the season from Joey Mattina at 31:24. Mattina put his second of the year past Clarkson goalie Adam Lamoreaux, making a quick run after taking a pass from Brendan Gorman and rifling a shot just under the crossbar. Mattina scored his second of the game after taking Mike Manfredi's pass and putting it past Lamoreaux on the ground. Mattina finished the game with two goals and three assists for seven points, one short of the Saint record for points in a game.
