



Frequently Asked Questions

Where is the St. Lawrence University Women's Soccer Academy held?

The Academy is held on the St. Lawrence University Campus

Where do I check in?

Check in will take place at Reiff Hall on the campus of St. Lawrence University between 11:00 AM and 1:30 PM on the First Day of the academy. Commuters will check in each morning at Reiff College at 8:00 AM. For a campus map and directions, please visit: <http://www.stlawu.edu/campusmap/map.html>

Who are the coaches at the St. Lawrence University Women's Soccer Academy?

St. Lawrence University Head Coach Franco Bari and some of the finest Div I, Div II, Div III, NAIA, Jr. College and Club coaches in the region. In addition, STLGSA SLU is committed to bringing in current women's soccer players.

What if I have to cancel my registration?

CANCELLATIONS for any reason will result in forfeiture of \$150 deposit. Cancellations or withdrawal from camp within one week of the camp start will result in forfeiture of entire camp tuition unless we've received a medical note.

Where do the campers stay and eat?

ACCOMMODATIONS: Players will be housed in The Reiff College Dormitory. The players who stay in the dorms are under supervision of coaches and counselors who will also stay in the dorms. Roommate preferences will be taken into consideration when assigning rooms and need to be indicated on the online registration. A sleeping bag or sheets, towels and toiletries are the academy members' responsibility. See What to bring.

Will my child be supervised in the dorm?

Yes! Every camper will be assigned to a coach or counselor. Coaches and counselors will be housed at the end of each dorm wing and each dorm floor. Non staff adults will NOT be allowed on floors outside of check - in and check - out.

Does the Academy provide accommodations for the night before or after camp?

NO.

How do I reserve a spot in the camp?

A \$150 deposit is required to reserve a spot in the Academy. The balance must be received prior to the deadline listed on the camp brochure or the spot will be forfeited with NO REFUND OF THE DEPOSIT. There are LIMITED SPACES available for the Academy. Applications will be accepted on a first come first serve basis. Applications will be accepted only as long as there are spots available at the Academy.

How do I know that I have been accepted into the Academy?

A confirmation e-mail will be sent.

Is there a Medical Release Form and Health Form to fill out?

How do I pay my balance and where do I send it?

What does each academy member receive?

Each academy camper receives a T-shirt and an opportunity to purchase a ball.

Does my child need to bring his or her own water?

Water stations will be placed on the field and water will always be available for the campers. However, we strongly encourage all our academy members to bring their own water bottle to help reduce the environmental impact of throwing away paper cups after each trip to the water jugs.

Will there be medical staff at the academy?

A certified athletic trainer will be on site at all times. Hospital services are always available in case of emergency. STLGSA is a fully insured Academy, but academy members must also provide their own medical insurance.

What happens if my child is injured or sick during the academy?

Qualified trainers will be on duty for the duration of the academy to care for minor injuries and illness. Parents or guardians will be contacted immediately if there is a serious injury or a child needs to leave camp early for a medical reason. Please make a notation on the health form if there is any medical condition we should be aware of in advance of the academy members attendance to our soccer academies. Our athletic trainer will be available for questions on the first day of each session and throughout the week.

If it rains, will camp be cancelled?

No, the camps will not be cancelled. We have indoor facilities.

What if my child is sick or injured and cannot attend the academy? Do I get a cash refund?

CANCELLATION POLICY: Cancellations must be requested in writing in order to receive either an academy voucher, applicable to the 2011 Soccer Academy or a cash refund. Your email request must be submitted to us at Fbari@stlawu.edu . Refunds and vouchers will be less a

\$150.00 administrative fee. CANCELLATION notices received after the deadline will only be eligible for a voucher for our following summer academy less the \$150.00 administrative fee. No refunds will be granted for cancellations within 2 weeks of the academy without a written doctors certificate. Once the doctors certificate is received your refund will be calculated less the cancellation fee of \$150.00 plus any out of pocket expenses (i.e., housing charges, dining charges, etc.) already incurred by the camp. If your child becomes sick or injured during camps you will be entitled to a prorated refund from the time you check-out of camp less any non-refundable camp charges (i.e., housing charges, dining charges, etc.) incurred by the camp. If camp is not notified of cancellation prior to start of camp, full tuition will be forfeited.

What should I bring to the academy, and what should I wear?

Players are strongly recommended to wear shinguards and cleats. Players should wear shorts and a T-shirt, but should pack something warm to wear in case of cooler weather or rain. Please be sure to bring enough clothes and socks for the entire academy. Academy members will not have access to laundry facilities. Overnight academy members should bring sheets and blankets or a sleeping bag, plus a pillow and towel and any toiletries they may need. Please refer to our [WHAT TO BRING LINK](#).

My child is a goalkeeper. Will you have goalkeeper coaches for his or her specialized training?

Yes, specialized goalkeeper training will be conducted during each camp week by our excellent goalkeeping staff. For the first two sessions of each day, the field players are trained together and the goalkeepers are taken aside and trained as a group.

Can I fax in my application?

Yes, but there's really no reason to. We must receive your original forms and all medical forms (along with your payment) in order to secure your child a spot in the academy. We will not hold a spot for a camper off of a fax request with no payment. We must receive your payment and/or deposit before the registration will be confirmed. Our fax number is 315-229-5589.

Can I pay by credit card?

No. In order to keep our academy increases to a minimum, we have discouraged taking credit cards. All payments must be made by cash, check or money order.

Are there any group discounts?

Yes. If you have a group of 5 or more, you will receive a \$50 per academy member discount for residential and \$25 discount for commuter. All applications must be mailed in together.

Are academy members required to wear the apparel they are given?

Each academy member can wear any soccer equipment they wish. There will be some instances where each camper will be asked to wear their academy t-shirt.

Can I request a roommate? Can friends have a room near each other?

Yes, we try to honor roommate requests in nearly every case. Both campers must request each other. We will also try to locate friends near each other if possible.

Will my daughter have access to phone facilities at the academy?

Yes, on the ground floor of each dorm a pay phone will be available.

Will my daughter have a refrigerator, TV and phone?

There are no refrigerators, televisions or phones available in dorm rooms.

What meals are provided?

Overnight academy members eat breakfast, lunch, and dinner. Commuter academy members are provided with lunch and dinner at our campus dining facilities.

Are the meals varied enough to accommodate vegetarians or allergies?

Absolutely, in the dining hall at St. Lawrence University we are very accommodating to vegetarians and those who have food allergies.

What is the ratio of staff and academy members?

The ratio is no greater than 8:1
