St. Lawrence Campaign Concludes with Celebration of Success

The Momentum St. Lawrence campaign began with a bang (and bright lights) in the fall of 2006, and concluded on December 31, 2010, with \$172.1 million in gifts to the University in support of scholarships, student fellowships, professorships, facilities and other purposes. "We thank all benefactors of St. Lawrence for the faith you have shown in your commitments," said Momentum St. Lawrence Chair R. Sheldon "Shel" Johnson '68.

The University's Momentum St. Lawrence campaign, which concluded December 31, 2010, was lauded on campus over the weekend of February 25-26. Events included a celebration dinner, seminars, a student talent show, and recognition

which commenced publically in 2006. The total is the most money ever raised in a campaign in the University's history.

of student academic and community leaders. Tours highlighted Johnson Hall of Science and the extensive renovations to Griffiths Arts Center, including the new Peterson-Kermani Performance Hall, both products of the campaign. Panel presentations focused on curricular steps forward thanks to the campaign, such as faculty-mentored student research.

During the weekend, it was announced that \$172.1 million had been raised during the campaign,

- Creation of 45 new endowed scholarships for students;
- Funding for 28 University Fellows, students selected to pursue independent research with faculty mentors;
- Six new endowed professorships;
- Additions and enhancements to facilities, including the award-winning Johnson Hall of Science; Sullivan Student Center; Diana B. Torrey '82 Health and Counseling

Center; Steiner Senior Townhouses; Pub 56, a social gathering space; new space for student radio station KSLU and performance venue Java; arts facilities throughout the Noble University Center, most notably Peterson-Kermani Performance Hall; athletic facilities, such as North Country Field, Leet-Hall Stadium and locker/meeting rooms for football.

Specifically, Momentum St. Lawrence raised:

- \$51.5 million for the University's endowment;
- \$41.1 million for facilities;
- \$20.9 million for program enhancements;
- \$37.2 million in support of the St. Lawrence Fund; and
- \$21.4 million in undesignated bequests or trusts; unrestricted gifts; gifts-in-kind; and miscellaneous gifts.

Announcing the totals, Momentum St. Lawrence Chair R. Sheldon "Shel" Johnson '68 said, "We thank our fellow trustees, and the members of the National Major Gifts Committee for their tireless and enthusiastic work. We thank the faculty, staff and students who inspired such philanthropy or worked as our partners. And we thank all benefactors of St. Lawrence for the faith you have shown in your commitments."

"Momentum St. Lawrence persevered through the recession starting in 2008, transforming the way students, faculty and staff live and learn at St. Lawrence in fundamental and important ways," said Vice President for Advancement Michael P. Archibald. "The vast majority of campaign objectives were met. We are profoundly grateful for the support we have received."

“Our Momentum Continues”

A celebratory dinner and a community indoor picnic highlighted the campaign conclusion observances on February 25-26, 2011. Several individuals offered remarks at one or both occasions, and they are excerpted here:

R. Sheldon Johnson '68 CHAIR, MOMENTUM ST. LAWRENCE

I greet you with a contradiction. We end our campaign, yet our momentum continues. We honor and thank the many dedicated people who gave to the recent comprehensive campaign, the largest in St. Lawrence's history.

As I look back over the seven years of the quiet and public phases of the campaign, I remember an early morning in June 2003 when President Dan Sullivan and University Advancement Vice President Mike Archibald met with me in my office. I knew they were considering a new campaign and was flattered when they asked me to chair the campaign, and then startled when they asked me to kick off the campaign with a significant leadership gift.

Thus the Momentum St. Lawrence campaign got under way, and it has been a rewarding and inspiring experience for me. I have met many interesting people, developed new friendships, and been inspired by the dedication and enthusiasm of alumni, students, faculty, staff, parents and friends of this University. It has been a delight to work with so many people who have been extraordinarily generous toward making this campaign a success.

It is with great pride that I tell you that Momentum St. Lawrence concluded on December 31, 2010, with the most money ever raised in a fundraising campaign at St. Lawrence. With the great help of you in this room and Laurentians around the world, we raised \$172.1 million. We raised these funds immediately after celebrating Campaign St.

Lawrence, which raised \$132 million. That's over \$300 million donated to St. Lawrence in the past 15 years.

As we celebrate the end of the campaign, the chair of our Board of Trustees, Don Rose, a physics major at St. Lawrence with a Ph.D. from Stanford University, would remind me of a fundamental scientific principle: A body in motion remains in motion. While our campaign has concluded, momentum continues.

Why do I say that?

When you look around this campus, you see evidence in every space, in every face, of the

enduring benefits of Momentum St. Lawrence:

- We have six newly endowed professorships, allowing the University to honor its best teachers and to use resources for faculty benefit. These will continue.
- We have 45 new scholarships providing funds that make St. Lawrence possible for the students who will thrive in our educational environment. These will continue.
- We have funding commitments for 28 new University Fellowships for students, with much of that

support coming from the Sullivan Student/Faculty Research endowment. These will continue.

- We have added 120 new named funds supporting student and faculty programs. These will continue.
- We point, with great pride and gratitude, to our award-winning Johnson Hall of Science as the center for the type of science education we believe is the most effective. This will continue.
- Students live 24/7 in the Sullivan Student Center, reading, writing, studying, meeting, playing the piano, making posters, watching movies, listening to musicians, grabbing an order of Eggs O'Larry in the morning and chicken parm at lunch time. The Sullivan Student Center pulses with the heartbeat of campus. This will continue.
- We can provide the best holistic care for students in the Torrey Health and Counseling Center. This will continue.
- The Steiner Senior Townhouses represent one of the most successful student life initiatives we've had, allowing seniors the chance for greater independence and self-governance while providing the benefits of campus support systems. This will continue.
- Visual, music and performing artists, and students of the arts, thrive in the renovated spaces of the Noble Center and Griffiths Arts Center, in particular the new Peterson-Kermani Performance Hall. This will continue.
- Students socialize in the Pub 56 and Java, and KSLU has a new

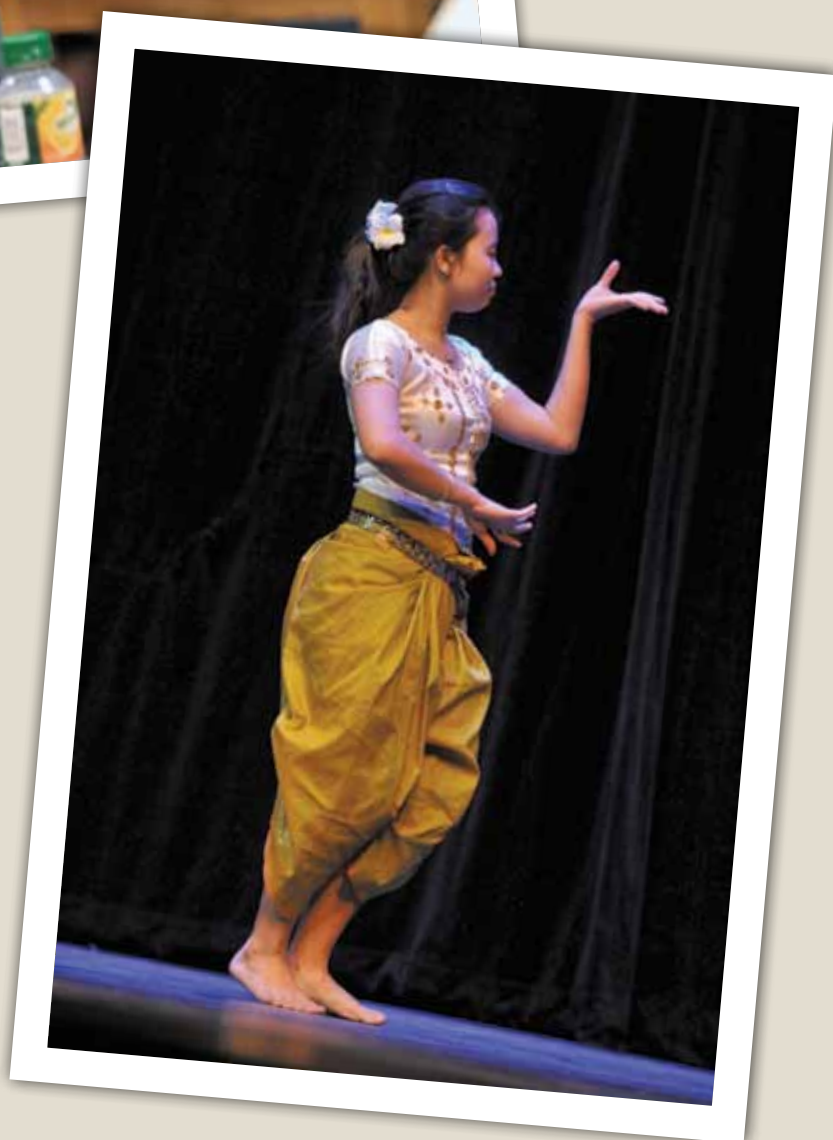

We are lucky to have generous donors who have allowed us to expand opportunities for both students and faculty over the past few years. This has provided the momentum necessary for us to attract and retain the excellent students and faculty who come to St. Lawrence.

It is impossible to note all of the ways that our teaching and learning have been enhanced by the campaign. Three areas (are) enhanced support for skill instruction for students, better integrated programs across the disciplines, and summer research and off-campus programs.

Skill Instruction

We have been engaged in a curriculum revision process that began with the faculty defining the skills that students most need to develop. Central among them are quantitative reasoning and communication skills. We end the campaign with

a Quantitative Resource Center, and with an enhanced Rhetoric and Communications Program. The QRC, and the staff who provide leadership, mean that the ability of faculty to teach many classes is made easier. Teaching about writing and speaking requires that faculty reflect on their own practices in ways that make them more effective as communicators.

Integrated Programs

If we are to educate students with the ability to solve (or even understand) real-world problems or develop creative projects that take advantage of new technologies, [they must be] able to think from multiple perspectives and/or use multiple media and understand how to make connections across perspectives and media. This campaign has helped us to move forward with enhanced cross-disciplinary conversation and planning. The arts have been brought together in a common space, one intended to foster inter-arts collaboration, and a grant has supported conversation intended to help both students and faculty see connections among the many possible ways that one can study the environment at St. Lawrence.

Summer Research and Off-Campus Programs

One of the central goals of the campaign has been to enhance those experiences that we know are most critical for fostering student learning. Mentored research and study abroad each do this. [Up to] 40 students are on campus each summer working with faculty on research; students [who] go abroad come back energized and engaged by what they have learned and experienced. [These opportunities] will be critical

to attracting students in the next few years.

What Was on Their Minds

As part of the Momentum celebration weekend, several seminars highlighted steps that St. Lawrence has made, thanks to Momentum support. These covered student-faculty research, arts facilities and programs, curricular innovations, the Davis United World College Scholars program, and sustainability measures on campus.

The Arts at St. Lawrence:

MOVING FORWARD

An annotated tour of the new arts facilities, particularly Peterson-Kermani Performance Hall and the Newell Center for Arts Technology (NCAT), both of which were made possible through support of the Momentum campaign, was led by Rebecca Daniels of performance and communication arts, NCAT Director Chris Watts and Barry Torres, director of music ensembles.

Involving Students in Faculty Research Programs:

EXAMPLES FROM THE GEOLOGY DEPARTMENT

St. Lawrence's geology department is full of leaders in undergraduate research.

Five senior geology majors, John Murphy, Katie Hoskinson, Wendell Caesar, Ben Rendall and Jake Colony, presented their research on February 26. Their seminar, "Involving Students in Faculty Research Programs: Examples from the Geology Department," was part of the campus-wide celebration of the conclusion of the Momentum St.

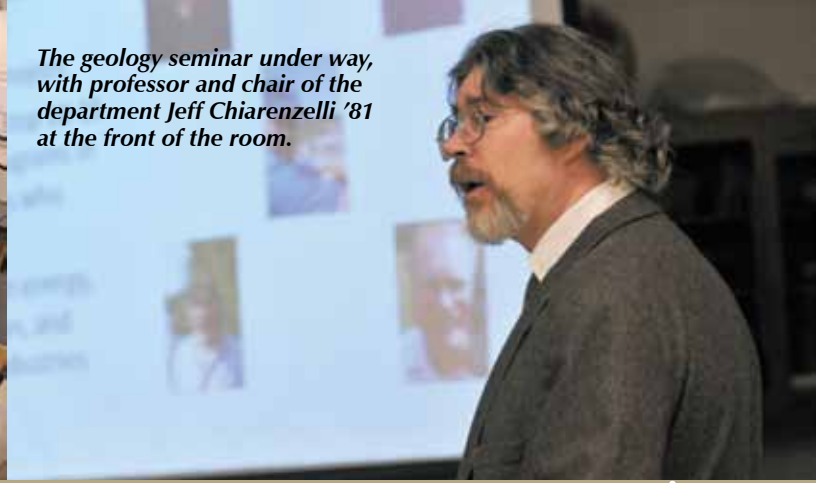
Lawrence Campaign.

Jeffrey Chiarenzelli '81, chair of the geology department, opened the seminar with a discussion of the department's commitment to undergraduate research. He stressed the importance of University Fellowship grants, funded by the Momentum campaign, which allow students to conduct research over the summer within beneficial professor/student mentorships. Four geology majors, including Murphy, conducted Fellowship research on campus last summer. (See related story on a new fellowship in honor of retiring Chapin Professor of Geology Mark Erickson, who pioneered off-campus summer research at St. Lawrence.)

Chiarenzelli said, "For us, the faculty, [undergraduate research] really makes our job exciting and fun. It keeps us active and engaged. It allows us to develop close personal working relationships with our students, and gives us good reasons to get into the field. For the students, I believe it provides an accessible role model, ways to develop their careers outside of the classroom, guidance, and the opportunity to explore their planned careers more fully."

Involving Students in Faculty Research Programs.....

All five panelists discussed sharing their summer 2010 research at the national Geological Society of America (GSA) annual conference in Denver last November. Hoskinson recalled how “we stood out for the caliber of our work.” This is evident in the two Best Poster awards that Murphy and Hannah Cowan '11 brought home, an award that has returned with SLU students for four consecutive years. “Some of us were even mistaken as graduate students,” said Hoskinson.

When an audience member asked what was the most memorable aspect of conference attendance, Caesar replied, “Just being there. I never thought I would have research to present to anyone,” let alone to hundreds of geologists. At his first conference, Caesar met a geologist whom he heavily referenced in his poster and research.

Such events are “neat ways to meet world experts,” claimed Rendall. He described the time he met one of the world’s leading paleontologists, Andrew B. Smith of the Natural History Museum in London. Dr. Smith and Rendall exchanged ideas across the Atlantic after the conference, furthering

Rendall’s insights into his findings.

The students have realized that their research has tangible effects. Murphy, alongside Chiarenzelli, recently presented his Fellowship research results on stream water chemistry in St. Lawrence County to the county Environmental Management Council. “[The Council members] were excited for a future publication and further results,” Murphy said. “They were glad to see my results in a geo-database for potential future use,” and they want to involve district schools in monitoring these streams, he added.

Meanwhile, according to Rendall, his research will allow him to describe two new species of fossil echinoids (such as sea urchins and sand dollars), and report three new specimens of another echinoid, of which there is only one other existing specimen. Additionally, he is describing a new genus and recording one genus that has been described before but never from North America. Describing and naming them “will lay the foundation for work and experiences I will have later on,” he said.

Murphy and Rendall plan to attend graduate school in the fall,

and both said that the research they have done as undergraduates is paving the way for fruitful careers in geological research and academia.

Carol Smith, SLU grants manager, said it is very rewarding to hear what the students get out of their research: “It is gratifying to meet the students, and eye-opening to hear about the experiences and contacts they gain. The enthusiasm in this department is infectious.”

Curricular Change and Innovation:

KEEPING A ST. LAWRENCE EDUCATION CONNECTED

At the curriculum presentation, First-Year Program director Cathy Crosby-Currie (below) showed images of students participating in various community-based learning projects and read student statements describing their experiences. All feedback was extremely positive; students said time and again that their CBL engagement was by far

the richest of their St. Lawrence experience.

Associate Dean Karl Schonberg discussed St. Lawrence's participation in a nationwide project of the Association of American Colleges and Universities to investigate aspects of global learning such as outcomes; he pointed out "we are preparing students with the tools they will need to acquire skills for a world we can't even imagine 20 or 30 years from now." Eric Hanson '70, a Momentum St. Lawrence supporter who traveled from his home in Burlington, Vt., for the weekend, stressed the value of student reflection upon their home culture in the U.S. as well as engagement in international study.

From the United World Colleges to St. Lawrence: STUDENTS RAISE AWARENESS OF GLOBAL ISSUES

The Davis United World College Scholars program helps take teaching from the textbook to the classroom by placing students from across the world at U.S. colleges including St. Lawrence University.

Four of these students sat on a panel to raise awareness on global issues, as well as connect their experiences with the United World Colleges (UWC) to their education at St. Lawrence, during the Momentum St. Lawrence Campaign Celebration Weekend.

The UWC is a group of 13 colleges on five different continents, welcoming high school students from across the globe to "foster international and intercultural education and understanding," the UWC mission states. Many students spend their latter high school years at one or more of these institutions, most earning their International Baccalaureate (IB) diploma – a program that encourages students to "ask how to learn," "develop a strong sense of their own identity and culture" and "develop the ability to communicate with and understand people from other countries and cultures," according to the mission statement. In essence, this curriculum allows students to receive an education in the global sense to influence change in the local sense.

St. Lawrence is one of 91 private institutions that participate

in the Davis UWC Scholars program, started by the Davis family in 2000 to help international students study in the United States. The program currently supports over 2,000 undergraduates worldwide in matriculating to private American colleges and universities from their respective UWC schools.

The panel, led by Assistant Professor of Government Shelley McConnell, consisted of students from four different countries who share a passion for peace and a sustainable future throughout the world.

"We are all dreamers," Lukasz Niparko '13 of Poland said. "UWC and St. Lawrence have helped me look at the world with a holistic perspective." Arnela Becirbasic '12 of Bosnia agreed, stating that "UWC was what helped me start dreaming, but SLU has helped me form a strategy on how to make my dreams come true."

Facundo Rivarola '14 of Paraguay said that what attracted him to St. Lawrence was the global studies major: "St. Lawrence had a major unlike any other I had seen, one with a broad perspective on the world, and I knew that was

the way I wanted to learn." Khadeeja Hamid '11 of the Maldives expressed thanks for the opportunities she has gained through St. Lawrence as well, such as working on her Senior-Year Experience in India, studying women's rights firsthand.

All of the students on the panel hope to go back to their home countries and spread the knowledge they've gained after their time at SLU is done, through non-profits and human rights organizations.

"I believe having students like these four takes the global conversation from a structured frame to the personal level," said Professor McConnell. "I have learned so much from them, as have my other students, simply through their presence in the classroom."

Greening the Campus

Coordinator of Sustainability Projects Louise Gava '07 led an energetic session on the University's efforts toward energy conservation and carbon neutrality. "You can't be a Luddite if you want to be sustainable," she stated, indicating that sustainability efforts require the

embrace of new technologies. She commented that sustainability occurs at the intersection of ecological, social and economic action (see Fig. 1).

Noting that 51% of the University's carbon discharge results from the heating of campus buildings (see Fig. 2), she described steps the University has taken to reduce that discharge over time. She cited Johnson Hall of Science, one of the most visible outcomes of Momentum St. Lawrence, as a new building that was constructed with sustainability in mind, leading to its winning a gold medal in the Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) green building certification system developed by the U.S. Green Building Council.

Gava also discussed SLU's electricity reduction measures, again noting the shining example of Johnson Hall. She cited the importance of "getting a handle" on campus electricity consumption, and, as a step toward achieving that, noted that whereas not long ago there were just three meters for approximately 100 campus buildings, today 74 buildings have their own. The goal, she explained, is to track peak use, which varies from building to building, and then develop ways to reduce consumption during those times. She discussed the eventual launch of competition among living units, not only to educate students about energy use, but also to encourage them to devise ways to limit it. "We can, over time, make behavior decisions based on energy use (with the benefit of) instant feedback," Gava concluded.

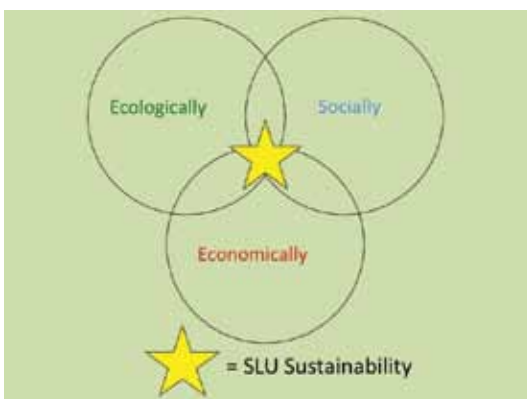

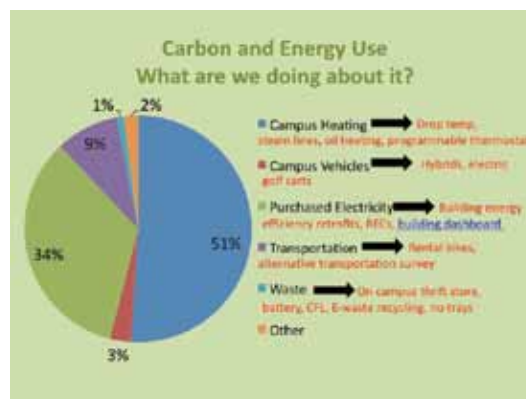
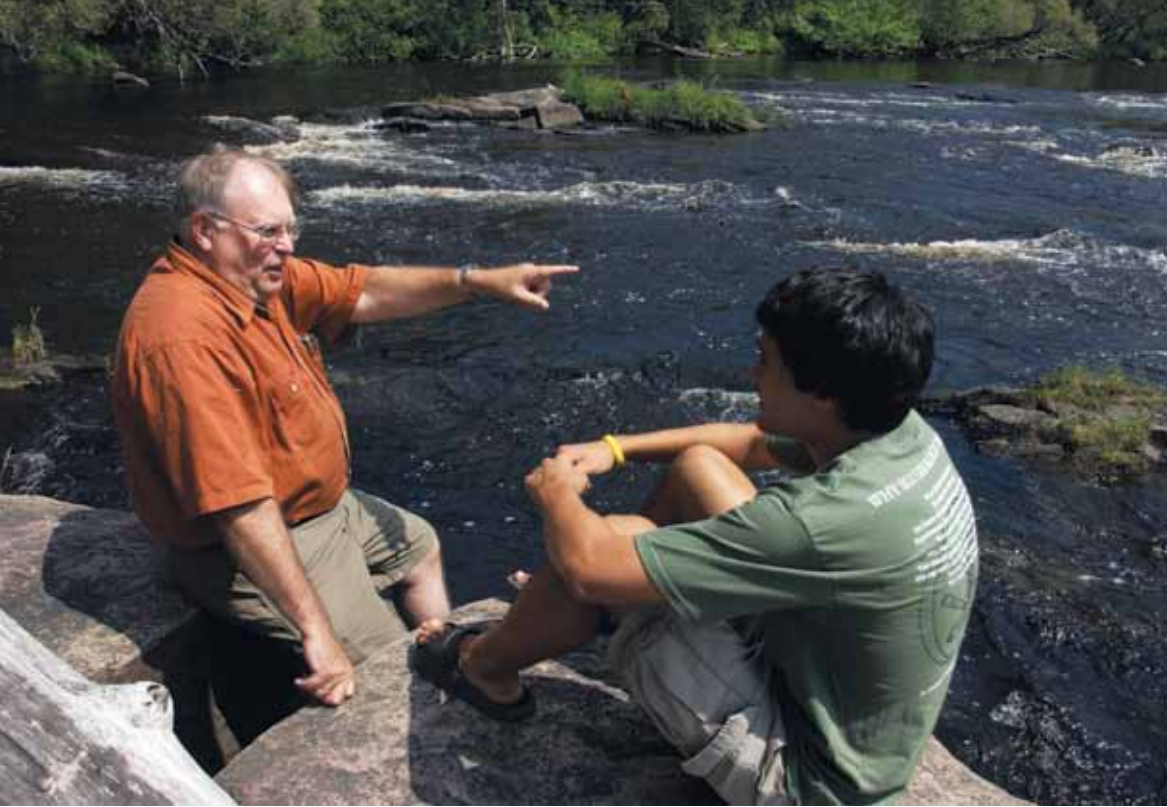

Erickson Fellowship Honors Retiring Geology Professor

Mark Erickson pioneered undergraduate student research

One of the great legacies of the Momentum St. Lawrence campaign is University Fellowships, which make it possible for students to work one-on-one with faculty mentors on summer research projects. The campaign may have concluded, but fellowships are still being created – an example of momentum moving forward.

Chapin Professor of Geology Mark Erickson retires this spring after 40 years on the faculty. Erickson pioneered summer field work for geology students, taking more than he can count during summers and the academic year to New Jersey, Ohio, occasionally Florida, Ireland and the Yucatan, and especially North Dakota.

In honor of his service and his influence upon generations of students, several alumni have banded together to institute the Dr. J. Mark

Erickson Geology University Fellows Endowment. In the words of the enabling document, the endowment “was established in 2009 through the generosity of alumni, family, and friends . . . to acknowledge Dr. Erickson’s legacy of passionate teaching and dedication and commitment to students by endowing a University Fellowship in his name and honor. The University Fellow selected should embody the characteristics that make Dr. Erickson so special to this community – passion for learning both in and out of the classroom and loyalty to fellow students and associates.”

“A believer in students doing research”

Sarah Zimmerman McElfresh

’98, one of the driving forces behind the creation of the fund and chair of a committee of nine alumni that coalesced to determine how to honor Erickson upon his impending retirement, says, “Mark was a believer in students doing research long before it was the ‘in’ thing for undergraduate liberal arts universities. He strove to have as many geology students as possible involved in research. His scores of abstracts and papers co-published with students testify to that. The number of honors theses and the number of eventual Ph.D.s that have come out of the SLU geology department are most impressive for a school the size of SLU.”

McElfresh continues, “For these reasons we felt that a fellowship to enable future generations of geology students to

do independent research would be a fitting tribute to Mark and leave a permanent legacy for the department. It is our thank-you for his help in opening doors for us through exposing us to research. We know that that experience is part of what shaped us. We ask our fellow alums to donate to the fellowship in honor of the man who made this possible for many of us, so that many more can benefit as well. And so many have made gifts of all sizes!”

Major supporters of the endowment fund are Douglas E. ’75 and Kathryn Klopfer O’Brien ’76. A petroleum geologist with Texas Crude in Houston, Doug says, “St. Lawrence is a school that changes people’s lives because one is afforded opportunities to ‘become all you can be.’ Mark Erickson presented those opportunities to me, and I will be

forever grateful.

“I started at St. Lawrence in 1971, the same year Mark joined the faculty,” O’Brien continues. “Mark immediately obtained grants that allowed him to spend the entire summer at the Fox Hills Formation in North Dakota with students of all levels. I was one of those students. That work in the field with Mark, and the analysis and research that continued back in Canton, was the start of my career as a geologist and a scientist.”

Erickson describes a special experience he, O’Brien, Mark Klett ’74 and other students had there: “When working together on one outcrop we made some remarkable discoveries of a new species of fossil horseshoe crab and a beautiful leaf flora [pictured]. We named and published that species, *Casterolimulus kletti*, in honor of Mark’s work, the next year.” Erickson notes that Dan Peppe ’03 worked on that same fossil 30 years later.

“The Gift of Mentorship”

“Mark Erickson has been offering the gift of mentorship to countless students for 40 years,”

O’Brien continues. “Who knows how many lives he has enriched by showing people that they can discover something, that their thoughts and ideas matter and are of interest? Even if a student does not select a career in geology, that field experience and subsequent research with a mentor is transforming.”

Another supporter, Ned Baker ’86, comments, “Mark Erickson has long been an advocate of research and was one of the people who encouraged me to do a senior thesis. This fellowship will help future students do summer research in support of senior theses with much greater ease.” He hopes other alumni will contribute to the fund, saying “A gift in Mark’s honor will perpetuate Mark’s love of research and enable more students to become better geologists.”

Erickson comments, “This fellowship supports exactly the sort of thing that geology students have needed for so long. Our students need financing for off-campus field work – money for food, camping and gas so they can get to remote

field sites. Only after that work is completed do they need to be on campus for lab work. This fellowship should encourage such projects. It’s important and valuable because it supports students who have real questions to test off campus, in the field, where our data begin.

“The fellowship is a vote of confidence in the pedagogical value of field work,” Erickson adds. “It is humbling when people give of their own resources for such a thing. For SLU it means that a high-quality research program in geology will be even stronger as long as we can attract students who enjoy the science and faculty who can teach it well.”

Gifts have come from other sources as well. Anonymous parents of a geology student, inspired by their child’s extraordinary development working with Professor Erickson and the other geology faculty, recently pledged \$100,000 to the Erickson endowment fund, bringing the total in cash and commitments as of mid-March 2011 to over \$200,000.

More Than Just Numbers

Increased scholarship support was one of the principal objectives of Momentum St. Lawrence, and during the campaign 45 new scholarships were established. Scholarship donors and their recipients often bond; the following story chronicles one of those relationships.

What do scholarships and running have in common?

For Peter E. Van de Water '58, Elizabeth "Becky" Blaisdell Van de Water '60 and Wendy Pavlus'11, the two have brought them together. In fact, Wendy and the Van de Waters have developed a relationship beyond that of mere scholarship donor and recipient. A Tupper Lake, N.Y., resident, Wendy says, "I'm not that far from home, but it's nice to know that if I ever need someone I can go to the Van de Waters," who live in Canton, a stone's throw from campus.

Several years ago, the Van de Waters set up two scholarships in honor of their parents, with preference to North Country students at St. Lawrence. A sociology major and multiple national champion runner, Wendy holds the Thomas

H. Blaisdell and Marion Brown Blaisdell '32 Scholarship, named after Becky's parents.

Peter Van de Water says, "One reason I'm interested in scholarships is because I wouldn't have been at St. Lawrence without one." He recalls that there were relatively few scholarships when he was a student. The family who had set up his scholarship lived in Connecticut and the only contact he was able to have with them came via a thank-you note by surface mail.

"A lot of students who have similar scholarships are too far from the donors to connect with them, except through e-mail," says Wendy. "I see the Van de Waters all the time, at the gym and everywhere around campus, and that's nice."

The Van de Waters and Wendy connect not only through the scholarship; running has also brought them together. Peter remembers seeing Wendy run when she was a student in high school before coming to St. Lawrence; now they watch the four-time national champion who was featured in *Sports Illustrated's* "Faces in the Crowd" last December (sportsillustrated.cnn.com/scoreboard/faces/2010/12/13) run in college. His father, John W. Van de Water '35, was a record-holding runner at St. Lawrence, and the Van de Waters' children have been runners as well.

Even with the elite athlete's busy training schedule, Wendy and the Van de Waters make time to keep in touch with each other. Becky notes that they always invite

their scholarship recipients to their house for dinner. Wendy adds, "I get e-mails from Peter all the time."

The Van de Waters are equally interested in what Wendy, a graduating senior, will be doing in the future. Peter says, "We'll follow Wendy with a great deal of interest, and if she becomes an Olympic runner we'll say 'Oh, yes, we remember when...'"

Where Do We Go From Here?

University Poised to Take Several Strides Forward; Gifts Still Needed

The completion of the Momentum St. Lawrence campaign provides an opportunity to step back, take a deep breath and plan what Vice President for University Advancement Michael P. Archibald calls “the next iteration of University fundraising, whatever form that may take.” This planning phase is expected to last for about a year; “in the meantime, gifts are as important as ever to enable us to continue delivering the excellence that we have all come to associate with St. Lawrence,” Archibald adds.

Many factors will play a role in the planning process, as St. Lawrence both continues to address the effects of the nationwide economic recession and prepares to move forward based on several studies and reports. Archibald indicates several:

- As a result of the recession, one of the first initiatives President Fox undertook was to appoint a task force focused on cost reduction; its recommendations reduced the operating budget by \$5,000,000, or about 5%, in 2009-10.

- Meanwhile, a market research study conducted by the consulting firm Hardwick Day focused on perceptions of St. Lawrence held by prospective students; the study suggests several goals and objectives for SLU to aspire to in the near future, such as:

- ◆ That SLU continue to identify its programs and opportunities as strengths.
 - ◆ That financial aid remain a hallmark of the University.
 - ◆ That a business program, internships and other forms of experiential learning will attract top students.
- In 2010-11, a second task force was assembled and made many recommendations, including the following:
 - ◆ That St. Lawrence add an additional 160 undergraduate students, at a rate of 40 per year, beginning with the Class of 2015, thus lowering

the discount rate, the overall percentage by which tuition revenue is reduced by providing students with aid.

- ◆ To accommodate increased enrollment, that more students be enabled to live and study off-campus, especially in the non-Western world.
- ◆ That experiential learning be a strong and integrated component of a St. Lawrence education.
- ◆ That St. Lawrence move in the direction of guaranteeing internships to all students who want one and begin the process of raising funds to ensure that such internships are not a financial burden for students.
- ◆ That the University develop a business program, to include a major, a minor, and other opportunities, such as the aforementioned internships,

and expand its summer academic offerings.

- ◆ That the University aggressively pursue plans to increase energy efficiency and develop a comprehensive transportation strategy.
- Based on all of these findings, President Fox then announced his intent to create a strategic planning council to develop a “strategic map” for the University.

Between now and October, the campus community and the board will consider the recommendations from the second recession response task force, the findings from the Hardwick Day study and the work of the strategic planning council to develop a strategic plan for the University by late in 2011.

A campus master plan for facilities will overlap with this plan and begin in summer 2011 as well, so that “By sometime in early 2012 we expect to have a fully developed strategic plan for the University for the next several years,” says Archibald. “In the meantime, as we move from the a spirit of post-recession thrift to new innovation, we can cite the New York City Semester Program and the on-campus innovation grants program as examples of forward thinking and a spirit of optimism at St. Lawrence.” For more on both of these exciting initiatives, see the Summer 2011 *St. Lawrence* magazine.
