Sneak Peek:

The Saints return to action after a week off as they travel south to Geneva, N.Y. to face the undefeated No.11 Hobart Statesmen. St. Lawrence is looking to return to the win column after back-to-back losses to Rochester and Rensselaer prior to the bye week.

The Series:

Today's game marks the 78th meeting between the Saints and the Statesmen, with Hobart holding the edge 39-36-2. Last season, Hobart edged St. Lawrence in a 21-10 win in Canton. The series returns to Geneva for the first time since 2002, after two straight meetings on Weeks Field at Leckonby Stadium. The Saints last win over the Statesmen came in 1991, a 41-0 shutout.

At the helm:

Chris Phelps (St. Lawrence '91) is in his fifth season as the head coach at his alma mater. Coach Phelps posts an 8-37 record at St. Lawrence and a career record of 12-43. He returned to his alma mater in December of 2000 after stints at the University at Albany, the University of New Hampshire, Hobart College, and Siena College.

Last Time Out:

The Saints got on the board early, when junior Matt Bezio connected with O'Donnell on a 21-yard pass to put St. Lawrence up 6-0 with just 2:08 gone in the first quarter. The touchdown strike capped an eight play-68 yard opening drive. The Engineers tried to answer with a long drive, marching down to the Saints two-yard line. But two bad snaps and a 26-yard tackle for loss by junior Hank Anderson and the Engineers were pushed back to the 26-yard line for fourth down. RPI quarterback Jimmy Robertson was injured on the Anderson tackle and back-up Josh Chiappone came in and threw a 21-yard pass to Jon Branche, but the Saints defense stepped up and brought him down at the five-yard line where the St. Lawrence offense would take over.

After forcing a three-and-out for the Saints offense, Rensselaer answered with a five-play 35-yard drive with 6:26 to play in the opening quarter. Robertson returned at QB on the drive and threw a seven-yard touchdown pass to Branche to bring RPI within one. The point-after was good and the score stood at 7-7. RPI took over again after another three and out by the Saints. Eleven plays and 53 yards later, Robertson connected with Branche on an 11-yard toss to give the Engineers the lead. On the point-after, sophomore Josh Hodges stepped through and blocked Drew Taranto's kick. With just 38.1 seconds remaining in the quarter, RPI held a 13-7 lead.

In the second quarter, Rensselaer's drive was interrupted by an injury to an offensive lineman who had to be taken off on a stretcher. Several plays later, at fourth-and-26 from the Saint 20-yard line Robertson was flushed out of the pocket by senior Jason Antin. Freshman Andy Welkley, getting his first start at corner, went up high and pulled in his first career interception for the Saints. St. Lawrence was unable to capitalize on the turnover and went three-and-out. After holding the Engineers on fourth down, the Saints took over and on third down, Bezio fumbled. RPI recovered on the first play, Robertson connected with Branche on a 22-yard strike to push the lead to 19-7. With a bad snap on the point-after, holder Brendan McGowan rolled out and connected with Adam Van Horn for the two-point conversion. Forcing another three-and-out, Rensselaer added to its lead with a 25-yard run by Jay Bernardo on fourth down with 1:51 to play in the half.

Bernardo rushed for his second touchdown of the day with 7:25 to play in the third quarter on a one-yard scramble. On the preceding play, Bernardo had rushed for 29 yards before being brought down by Welkley just shy of the goal line. The Saints got back on the scoreboard after a fumble recovery by senior Joe Bertino on the Engineers 27-yard line. Bezio connected with O'Donnell on a 24-yard strike for his second of the day. Little's point-after try was wide left and the score stood at 35-13 with 4:11 to play in the third. The catch was O'Donnell's team-leading sixth touchdown reception of the season, giving him nine for his career.

Air Attack:

In just four games this season, senior quarterback Tom Anderson has completed 64-of-109 passes for 727 yards and six touchdowns. Anderson missed the Rensselaer game due to a hamstring injury, but is expected to return against the Statesmen. Against the Coast Guard Bears on Sept. 24, Anderson became the Saints career completions leader when he completed a six-yard pass to sophomore tight end Brett Young early in the fourth quarter. He finished the day with 303 career completions. At Norwich, he had a career long pass of 46 yards to senior fullback Carl Althans. For his career, Anderson has completed 322-of-606 passes for 3,666 yards - putting him on pace to break three more school records. Anderson has completed passes to eight different receivers. Bezio has also taken snaps at center, completing 20-of-49 passes for 265 yards. The Saints rank fourth in the Liberty League in Pass Offense (198.4 yards/game), Pass Efficiency (112.5) and Total Offense (370.2 yards/game). Anderson ranks fourth in the league in passing average (181.8 yards) and total offense (212.5 yards), and third in pass efficiency (121.9)

Sophomore Mike O'Donnell leads the Saints in receptions (22) and receiving yards (376). He ranks seventh in the league in receptions per game (4.40), fourth in receiving yards per game (75.2), 10th in all-purpose yards per game (92.0), and fifth in scoring (7.2 ppg). O'Donnell is just 21 yards shy of eclipsing his receiving yardage from last season. With six touchdown catches, he has already doubled his touchdown total from a year ago. Althans ranks second on the team in receptions with a career high 19 and receiving yards with 172 (also a career high). He ranks 10th in the league in receptions per game. Young ranks third on the team with 14 catches for 150 yards.

Ground Offensive:

St. Lawrence has rushed for 859 yards in five games, averaging 4.1 yards per carry, and 171.8 yards per game. Against Coast Guard, the Saints established a new single game best under Head Coach Chris Phelps, with 289 yards rushing. At Norwich on September 10, the Saints scored three rushing touchdowns. Only twice previously under Coach Phelps (at Utica Sept. 4, 2004 & against Kings Point Nov. 6, 2004) have the Saints scored three rushing touchdowns in a single game. The Saints 574 yards of total offense against Norwich is also a new single high under Coach Phelps. The Saints rank fourth in the league in rushing offense.

Eight Saints have carried the ball this season, led by a trio of seniors. Carl Althans leads with a career high 36 rushes for 211 yards. James Buchanan is second with 181 yards on 33 carries. Buchanan had a career high 109 yards rushing against Coast Guard on Sept. 24. Next up is Tom Gipson with 179 yards on 56 carries with two touchdowns. Althans ranks eighth in the league in rushing yards per game (42.2).

1,000-Yard Club:

Senior quarterback Tom Anderson is the only current Saint to have reached 1,000 plus yards in a single season. As a junior, Anderson threw for 1,563 yards and amassed 1,749 yards of total offense. Last season, Brett Hughes and Tom Gipson both came close, with 911 and 879 all-purpose yards respectively. So far this season, Anderson has 727 yards passing and 850 yards of total offense - well on his way to the 1,000 yard mark.

Records Watch:

Having already broken one career Saints record, senior quarterback Tom Anderson is on pace to break three more this season - yards passing, pass attempts and total offense. On Sept. 24 versus the Coast Guard Bears, with his 12th completion of the day, Anderson broke Kirk Dempsey's career completions mark of 301, set from 1975-77. In three-plus seasons, Anderson has passed for 3,666 yards on 322 completions, with 606 attempts. He has also rushed for 352 yards giving him 4,018 yards of total offense. He sits 486 yards shy of the

career passing record, 926 yards shy of Head Coach Chris Phelps' total offense record, and 31 pass attempts shy of Dempsey's career attempts. Anderson holds two other Saints records - also set against the Coast Guard Bears. In last season's meeting in New London, Conn., Anderson broke the single-game records for total offense and yards gained passing with 401 and 326 respectively.

Senior placekicker Nick Little is also on a record hunt. He has 21 career field goals, 6 shy of the career record held by both Ron Frissora and Rod Vesling.

Have a bagel Norwich:

St. Lawrence opened its season with a 36-0 win over Norwich on September 10, handing the Cadets their first "bagel" at home since a 37-0 loss to Kings Point in 2001 at Sabine Field. The "bagel" was the first for the Saints since a 1997 17-0 shutout over Norwich.

Honors:

Senior Nick Little was honored by the Liberty League on September 12, as the league's Special Teams Performer of the Week.

Little had a strong start to his senior season in the Saints 36-0 win over Norwich on Saturday. He was 3-4 on PATs and 3-3 on FGs, totaling 12 points on the day. He converted field goals of 42, 38, and 26 yards. With his first PAT of the day, Little reached the 100 point mark for his career. He finished the day with 111 career points. He is the first player under Head Coach Chris Phelps to reach the century mark. Little also averaged 60.4 yards on eight kickoffs and 37.0 yards on three punts.

Pin 'em back:

Senior Nick Little ranks third in the Liberty League in punting average at 36.3 yards per punt, putting nine inside the 20. Against Coast Guard on Sept. 24, he booted a season-high 61 yard punt, one yard shy of his career high. He also nailed a 56-yarded that pinned the Bears on their own two-yard line. On kickoffs, Little averages 54.7 yards, and has put 12 of 21 inside the five yard-line, including four touchbacks.

Getting Defensive:

The Saints defense is allowing 22.2 points and 373.8 yards per game after five games this season. In the Liberty League, St. Lawrence ranks tied for fifth in scoring defense (22.2 ppg) and rushing defense (148.6 ypg), third in opponent first downs (84), first in opponent fourth down conversion (33.3%), and second in opponent penalties (77.9 ypg).

St. Lawrence's leading tackler is sophomore Judin Pierre Louis, despite suffering a season-ending injury against Rochester. Having played in just four games this season, Pierre Louis leads the team with 40 tackles and ranks third in the league. Following Pierre Louis are a quartet of seniors - Jason Antin, Terrell Foster, Joe Bertino and Chris Young. Antin and Foster are tied for second with 37 tackles each, followed by Bertino with 32 and Young with 28.

Antin and Foster are tied for eighth in the league in tackles per game (7.4). Antin also ranks tied for eighth in

sacks with 3.5 and third in tackles for loss with 8.0. Foster ranks sixth in tackles for loss with 6.5.

Red Hot Zone:

The Saints were red hot in the red zone at Norwich on September 10, going five-of-five (100%) inside the Cadets' 20-yard line. St. Lawrence scored three touchdowns and converted two field goals. Overall this season, the Saints are 8-of-12 inside their opponents' 20-yard line with 48 points on six touchdowns and two field goals.

St. Lawrence ranks sixth in red zone offense (66.7%) and tied for second in the league in red zone defense (60.0%).

In 2004, the Saints went 21-of-33 (63.6%) inside the redzone, scoring 125 points on 16 touchdowns and five field goals.

Whatta Year:

In 2004, the Saints had their best season in over 13 years, finishing with a 4-6 overall record and a 3-4 Liberty League mark. The last time a Saints football team won more than four games in a single season was in 1991 when St. Lawrence finished 6-4. Along with the team's success, numerous Saints earned post-season honors.

Tight end Brett Young was named the Liberty League Rookie of the Year, earned Liberty League First-Team Offense honors and was named to the Football Gazette's All-East Team. Placekicker/punter Nick Little earned Liberty League First-Team Special Team's honors as well as being named to the Football Gazette's All-East Team. Offensive lineman Pat Reagan earned ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America Football Second-Team Offense honors in December. He is the first-ever Football Academic All-America for St. Lawrence.

Seven other Saints earned Liberty League All-Star honors: left tackle Chris Fee, defensive end Jason Antin, defensive end Joe DeLaura, outside linebacker Mike Reed, corner Randy Pifer, free safety Dan Haley, and tailback Brett Hughes. Nine Saints were named to the Liberty League All-Academic Team: fullback James Buchanan, wide receiver Gary Gaines, fullback Joe Kondratowicz, offensive lineman Reagan, wide receiver Gabe Sataloff, corner Adam Smith, offensive lineman O.C. West, offensive lineman Dan Yanulavich, and defensive lineman Herb Yancey.

St. Lawrence has improved leaps and bounds since Head Coach Chris Phelps took over the program. Last season, the Saints were better than in 2003 in every statistical category except passing yards, penalties, punting average, and fourth down conversion. The Saints averaged 19.7 points and 337.0 yards per game, scoring six more touchdowns than in 2003. St. Lawrence also turned over the ball three fewer times. On the defensive side of the ball, Saints opponents scored 4.6 fewer points per game (46 on the season), posted 471 fewer rushing yards, 410 fewer yards of total offense and ran 62 fewer plays. St. Lawrence sacked opposing quarterbacks twice as many times (26) and intercepted twice as many passes (8) than in 2003.

The Century Club:

Placekicker Nick Little became the first Saint player under Head Coach Chris Phelps to reach the 100 career point mark on September 10 at Norwich. Little entered the game with 99 career points (48 PATs and 17 FGs). It took him just 14:31 into the game to reach the century mark. Senior quarterback Tom Anderson scored on a 14-yard run, setting up Little's PAT attempt. The kick was good and Little sat at 100 career points. He went on to convert two more PATs and three field goals, finishing the day with 12 points and 111 career points. Little now sits at 119 career points with four FGs and eight PATs on the season.

Lightning Quick:

Junior Matt Bezio has used his lightning quick speed - he runs a 4.5 in the 40 - to excel on special teams for the Saints. On his first collegiate kick return against Norwich in 2003, Bezio bolted through the Cadets' return unit for 35 yards. Despite a knee injury that has hampered him since early in 2004, Bezio has piled up 793 return yards, 24 rushing yards, and 452 yards passing in the last two-plus seasons. This season, Bezio has 218 return yards, he ranks third in the Liberty League in punt return average (10.7).

"The Plague":

After having been plagued by injuries in 2004, the Saints were hoping to escape in 2005. But it's started already. Senior defensive back Ryan DePoy will miss the majority of the season due to a knee injury suffered over the summer. Senior outside linebacker and co-captain Mike Reed suffered a knee injury in the annual Scarlet and Brown game and missed the Norwich game. He made his season debut at Alfred. Junior defensive tackle Joe DeLaura suffered a shoulder injury against Fairleigh-Dickinson in the preseason scrimmage, but returned for the Saints game against the Cadets. Sophomore inside linebacker Judin Pierre Louis suffered a bruised kidney against Rochester and will miss the remainder of the season. Senior quarterback Tom Anderson strained his hamstring the week following the Rochester game and missed the Rensselaer game. He is expected to return against Hobart. Junior free safety John Decker sustained a knee injury and also missed the Rensselaer game. He is also expected to return for the Hobart game.

The Statesmen:

The Statesmen are coming off a 27-9 home win over Kings Point last Saturday. Running back Doug Blakowski rushed for 149 yards and three touchdowns, while linebacker Jimmy Gradis led the defense with 10 tackles. Hobart sacked Kings Point's quarterbacks six times during the contest with defensive end Zach Young having a hand in four of them.

The Hobart defense kept Kings Point's ground game in check on Saturday. The Mariners finished the day with minus 10 yards rushing. The Statesmen defense pushed Kings Point backwards or held the Mariners for no gain on nine of their 28 running plays. It's the first time a Hobart opponent has finished the day with negative rushing yards since Oct. 17, 1998, when the Statesmen stopped Franklin & Marshall for minus 5 yards.

Thanks to a season-high matching six sacks against Kings Point, Hobart has as many sacks through six games (21) this season as the 2004 Statesmen logged in 11 games. Junior defensive end Andy Purdie leads the charge with 4.5 followed by Young and senior defensive tackle Rick Eicheldinger with 4.0 each.

The Statesmen have won 10 in a row at Boswell Field, dating back to a 20-12 loss to St. John Fisher on Nov. 8, 2003.

Senior corner back Jamie Anderson leads the Liberty League and is 36th in the nation in punt return average. He has 194 return yards on 16 tries for an average of 12.1.
