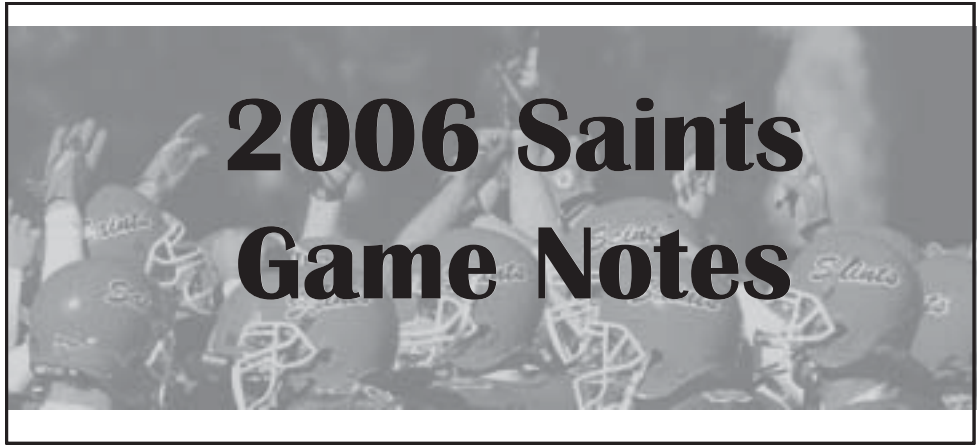

2006 Saints Game Notes

Extra Points

The Saints fell to the Alfred Saxons 17-14 last weekend after opening their 2006 season with a 17-13 win against Norwich Sept. 9. St. Lawrence now holds an all-time record of 357-433-35.

In his first five years as the head coach of the Saints, Phelps has coached 37 all-league players, 50 all-academic players, one league Rookie of the Year (Brett Young 2004) and two All-East players (Brett Young and Nick Little in 2004).

Tight end Brett Young has caught 11 passes for 134 yards this season. Young committed himself to an off-season regimen, putting on 17 pounds and improving in all areas of his lift tests. His combined lift total in the hang clean, squat and bench press totaled more than 1,000 pounds.

Almost half of the 2006 Saints roster is made up of freshman. St. Lawrence added 49 new players to their roster. They return only four offensive starters from last season: Chris Fee, Brett Young, Mike O'Donnell and Jeremy Cronin.

Scene Setter

St. Lawrence (1-1) and Johns Hopkins(1-1) will square off on Saturday in the first ever meeting between the two teams. The Blue Jays will travel to Canton, NY as the Saints are looking for their first 2-1 start since 1983. Kickoff is scheduled for Noon in Leckonby Stadium.

St. Lawrence is coming off a heartbreaking 17-14 loss to the Alfred Saxons. The Saints rallied back from a 14-0 halftime deficit to fall just three points short. The Saints defense held the Saxons to just three points in the final three quarters of the game.

At the Helm

St. Lawrence Head Coach Chris Phelps (St. Lawrence '91) is in his sixth season as the Saints head coach. Phelps owns an 9-41 record at St. Lawrence and a 13-48 career record. Phelps returned to his Alma Mater in December of 2000 after stints at the University of Albany, the University of New Hampshire, Hobart College and Sienna College.

Behind a solid work ethic, attention to detail and a dedicated coaching staff, Phelps' has helped to significantly increase the number of players in the Saints program. His eye for talent has shone brightly as the Saints have had 37 all-league players during a Phelps' tenure at St. Lawrence.

Jim Margraff enters his 17th season as the Johns Hopkins head coach. He is the all-time winningest coach at the school with a 103-59-3 record. Margraff led the Blue Jays to a Centennial Conference Championship in 2005 and its first ever NCAA appearance.

Fresh Faces

The Saints added 49 freshman to their 2006 roster, many of who will play key roles for the Saints this season. The loss of eight starters on offense, no returning tailbacks and an inexperienced offensive line will force the Saints coaching staff to call on some fresh faces when the Saints take the field on Saturday.

Hackett Ball

Freshman running back Connor Hackett is one of those fresh faces who will be asked to play a key role for the Saints in 2006. With no returning tailbacks from last year, Hackett earned the starting spot after competing against five other freshman during the pre-season. The six-foot-one, 190 pounds, All-State running back from Bronxville, N.Y. got his first college start Sept. 9 against Norwich. With 19 carries for 75 yards and a touchdown, Hackett was named Liberty League Co-Rookie of the Week for his performance. Starting again last weekend, Hackett earned his second touchdown of the season on a 16 yard touchdown run against Alfred for the Saints first score of the game.

The Front Five

Offensive line is another position where the Saints will rely heavily on young players. The Saints are not deep with experience in the front five. With the exception of seniors Chris Fee and O.C. West, who will start at left tackle and center respectively, the Saints will start three sophomores, with the majority of the back-ups being freshmen. Freshmen Carlos Cruz, Justin Wacenske, McLean Beyor, Alex Vendola and Jon Thomas are all listed in the two-deep for the Saints.

Waiting His Turn

Matt Bezio enters his first season as the starting quarterback for the Saints. After three seasons of serving as a special teams speedster and a back-up quarterback, Bezio will get his shot under center in 2006.

Last week, Bezio went 17 of 34 for 178 yards. Against Norwich, Bezio threw for 207 yards and one touchdown and had three scrambles for 8 yards.

Bezio's speed-he runs the forty-yard-dash in 4.5 seconds-cattupled him to fifth in the league last year in punt return yards with 130. In his career, he has accumulated 819 kick return yards.

Air Attack

Where the Saints lack experience in the backfield, they make up for at wide receiver and tight end. It will be the responsibility of a group of returning starters to make big plays for the Saints this season and they have two players more than qualified to step up to the task.

Junior wide receiver Mike O'Donnell earned Second-Team All-Liberty League honors in 2005 and was the Saints leading receiver on the season. Last weekend, he was the Saints leading receiver catching 6 passes for 111 yards including a 39 yard reception that set up the Saints second touchdown of the game. He also had a 23 yard kick-off return.

O'Donnell is accompanied by junior tight end Brett Young, who is coming off what Phelps called "one of the best off-seasons on the team." Young added 17 pounds of muscle in the off-season and it shown in the last two weeksn Young caught three passes for 26 yards last week and eight passes for 108 yards against Norwich.

Captains

Seniors Hank Anderson, Jordan Burger, Chris Fee and Jerrod Jones will captain the 2006 Saints. Anderson was the second leading tackler for the Saints in 2005. He recorded 58 tackles-3.5 for losses- a pair of sacks and an interception. Anderson leads the Saints this season with 19 tackles and an interception.

As a special teams stand-out and a linebacker in 2005, Burger excelled in the Saints first three games, accumulating eight tackles. Hindered by an injury for the remainder of 2005, Burger is the Saints third leading tackler with 14. He also had a pivotal game against Norwich, sacking the opposing quarterback for a loss on what would have been their game-winning drive.

Fee, a three-time all-league offensive tackle, has started every game in his first three seasons as a Saint. He was a third-team Football Gazette All-Region choice in addition to earning All Liberty League honors for the third consecutive season. He has contributed strong leadership and enthusiasm to a young offensive line.

Jones, the "general" of the Saints secondary had 35 tackles-16 unassisted- eight pass breakups and returned an interception for a touchdown in 2005. He has recorded 12 tackles and an INT in 2006.

A Quick Look At John Hopkins

Johns Hopkins (1-1) enters the contest coming off a bye week. The Blue Jays opened the season 1-0 after a 20-10 loss to Rochester but rebounded two weeks ago with a 21-14 come-from-behind win over Randolph-Macon.

With the game tied at 14-14 and less than three minutes remaining in the fourth quarter, the Blue Jays engineered a 12 play, 55 yard drive that was capped off by a 21-yard touchdown pass from senior quarterback Shane Kibbe to wide receiver Evan Earnest with just 43 seconds left in the game. That touchdown put the Blue Jays up 21-14 and sealed the victory that evened JHU's record to 1-1.

Kibbe went 21-36 for 164 passing yards while the Blue Jays handed off to four different rushers in their 116 yard performance on the ground. Phil Roberts led the Blue Jays with 17 carries for 55 yards and Mark Nesbitt carried nine times for 34 yards. Also involved in the Blue Jays running attack was Zach Rosswog and Kibbe, who carried four times for 17 yards.

Defensively, the Blue Jays are led by junior inside linebacker Ryan Johnstin, who is tied with outside linebacker Zach Rosswog with a team-high 12 tackles. Also at linebacker, junior Scott Meyers and senior Matt Hagel are close behind with 11 tackles. On the defensive line, seniors Anthony Woodard and Alan Cody will look to put pressure on Saints quarterback Matt Bezio.

The Last Time Out

The Saints lost to the Alfred Saxons 17-14, but showed tremendous heart in the second half of the contest, rallying from a 14-0 halftime deficit.

After surrendering 14 first quarter points, the St. Lawrence defense held Alfred to just three points in the final three quarters of play. The second half belonged to the Saints defense, as the momentum swung in the Saints favor immediately after the second-half kickoff. Senior linebacker Hank Anderson, who earned Liberty League Co-Defensive Player of the Week honors as the Saints leading tackler last week, intercepted Alfred's first pass of the half and returned it 18 yards to the Alfred 20. Although the Saints were unable to convert on the ensuing possession, the defensive unit forced the Saxons to a three and out on their next possession. That set up the Saints first scoring drive of the game. Freshman running back Connor Hackett broke loose for a 16 yard touchdown run that tightened the Saxons lead to 14-7.

The stingy Saints defense contained the Saxons to one first down on the next four drives before allowing a 22 yard field goal that gave the Saxons a 17-7 lead.

The Saints however did not give up. They responded on the next possession, driving 57 yards in just 54 seconds. A 39 yard pass play from quarterback Matt Bezio to Mike O'Donnell highlighted the six play drive that was capped off by a 5 yard touchdown pass from Bezio to Carl Festa. With just two and a half minutes left in the game however, the Saints were unable to muster another scoring drive and fell just shy of the tying score.

On Record Pace

Junior wide receiver Mike O'Donnell is on pace to catch John Crandall for most career pass receptions. During his career from 1975-1978, Crandall caught 130 passes. In his first two seasons, O'Donnell caught 64 passes. Last week, he caught 6 passes for 111 yards to add to his two grabs for 36 yards against Norwich. That gives him 72 career receptions and puts him past the halfway point to the record.

The 1,000 Club

Nine upperclassmen qualified for the Saints 1,000 club in 2006, an achievement the team recognizes when a player's weight room tests in the hang clean, squat and bench press total 1,000 pounds or more. Senior defensive tackle Joe DeLaura topped out the lift tests with a total of 1,355 pounds. Hank Anderson, Chuck Bradway, Jeremy Cronin, Tim LaRose, Matt Manchester, Nehemiah Nelson, Brett Young and Judin Pierre-Louis all joined DeLaura in the 1,000 club.

Canton, N.Y.-- The St. Lawrence football team opened the 2006 season with a 17-13 victory over visiting Norwich at Leckonby Stadium. The Saints smothered the Cadets offense, as the Saints "D" held Norwich to 138 yards of total offense and sacked quarterback Marcus Adames six times for a loss of 52 yards.

The Saints got on the board first on their final drive of the first quarter. Quarterback Matt Bezio connected with wide receiver Mike O'Donnell for a 17 yard touchdown pass that capped off an eight play 65 yard drive and put the Saints up 7-0 with two minutes and 56 seconds left in the first quarter. Norwich responded just seconds later as Darnell Jackson returned the ensuing kick-off 86 yards for a touchdown, tying the game at 7-7.

The Saints got on the board again early in the second quarter when freshman running back Connor Hackett scored from three yards out, earning his first touchdown as a college player and putting the Saints back on top 14-7.

The Jayhawks controlled the clock in the third quarter from the beginning. After Jackson fumbled the opening kick-off and the Saints recovered, the Saints strung together three productive drives in the quarter, but they could only convert on the final drive of the quarter when Matt Popov capped off a nine play, 37 yard drive with a 31-yard field goal, widening the Saints margin to 17-7.

The fourth quarter belonged to the Saints defense, who was on the field for more than 10 minutes in the quarter.

After surrendering a 13 play, 77 yard touchdown drive that tightened the Saints margin to 17-13 with one minute and 43 seconds left in the game, the defense stepped up and made plays when the Saints needed them the most.

On the ensuing kick-off, Norwich recovered an on-sides kick and with it a chance to win the game. That is when the Saints "D" pulled through with four straight plays to seal the Saints victory. Senior linebacker Jordan Burger sacked Adames for a nine yard loss on first down, the Saints brought Jackson down in the backfield on second down, senior defensive end Josh Hodges batted down Adames third down pass and senior free safety Jerred Jones intercepted the fourth down pass to put the game away.

The win gave the Saints (1-0) their third straight season-opening victory.
