Head Coach

PAUL FLANAGAN

Paul Flanagan enters his fifth season as the head coach of the Saint women's hockey team. Since taking the helm in the spring of 1999, Flanagan has coached the team to an NCAA national championship game and twice set school records for wins. Last season, the Saints advanced to the ECAC playoffs for the fifth consecutive season, before falling to Brown. The team finished with a 22-9-4 overall record and 10-4-2 conference record. Flanagan's career record stands at 86-42-12 in four seasons.

In 2001-02, the Saints made the ECAC playoffs, marching into the ECAC North semifinals before losing to eventual league-champion Brown and finishing the season with a 22-10-4 record.

In the 2000-2001 season, he led the team to the inaugural NCAA Women's Frozen Four where the Saints defeated top-ranked Dartmouth, 3-1, in the semifinal to earn the right to play for the national championship against Minnesota-Duluth, a game they lost, 4-2. That team, picked to finish sixth in the Eastern College Athletic Conference in the preseason, won a school-record 24 games against just eight losses and three ties, and finished third in the conference with an 18-4-2 record. It marked the second time a Flanagan-led team set the school record for wins and earned him the American Hockey Coaches Association and ECAC Coach of the Year honors as voted upon by his peers. The team finished third in both of the major polls, *USA Today/AHCA* poll and the *USCHO.com* poll, the highest ranking yet for the St. Lawrence women's program.

In his first season, 1999-2000, the team won a then-record 18 games, finishing the season at 18-15-1 and ninth-place ranking the national polls. Flanagan coached the Saints to a seventh-place finish and playoff berth in the Eastern College Athletic Conference with an 11-12-1 mark in conference play.

Along with his coaching duties, Flanagan sits on the advisory committee for the NCAA Women's Frozen Four. He is also a member of the AHCA and was voted on to the AWCHA's Association committee.

Before taking over as the women's head coach, Flanagan was an assistant with the St. Lawrence men's team for 11 seasons. He helped coach the team to ECAC championships in 1989 and 1992 and the NCAA tournament in 1989, 1992 and 1999.

Flanagan has earned both a Bachelor of Science degree and his Master of Education degree from St. Lawrence, where he was also a defenseman and a senior captain for the Skating Saints.

Flanagan and his wife, Sharon, have a daughter, Shannon (11), and two sons, Brendan (8) and Connor (4). He and his family reside in Canton.
