### Double/Combined Majors

- "All Graduates" uses an unduplicated student count
- Departmental data counts student once for each department
- Division data counts student once for each division unless both occur in same division, e.g., Biology-Physics. In this case, student is only counted once in Science division.

### Data Sources

- Placement rate and how closely job related to desired career path: Career Services Survey
- Internship participation: Self reported survey information and institutional data
- Post baccalaureate school information 5 yrs out: National Student Clearinghouse
